The radical renewal of a person's inner being by the work of God's Spirit.

## The need for regeneration

### <u>Jn 3:3</u>

John 3:3 (NASB95) — 3 Jesus answered and said to him, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born again he cannot see the kingdom of God."

## See also Eph 2:1; Eph 2:5; Col 2:13

Ephesians 2:1 (NASB95) — 1 And you were dead in your trespasses and sins,

**Ephesians 2:5 (NASB95)** — **5** even when we were dead in our transgressions, made us alive together with Christ (by grace you have been saved),

**Colossians 2:13 (NASB95)** — **13** When you were dead in your transgressions and the uncircumcision of your flesh, He made you alive together with Him, having forgiven us all our transgressions,

### Regeneration is a work of God

### It originates in God the Father

<u>Jn 1:12–13</u> Regeneration cannot be controlled by human actions or rituals; it is an act of God's sovereign will.

John 1:12–13 (NASB95) — 12 But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, even to those who believe in His name, 13 who were born, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God.

### It is made possible by the resurrection of Jesus Christ

### <u>1 Pe 1:3</u>

**1 Peter 1:3 (NASB95)** — **3** Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who according to His great mercy has caused us to be born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead,

See also Eph 2:4–5

**Ephesians 2:4–5 (NASB95)** — **4** But God, being rich in mercy, because of His great love with which He loved us, **5** even when we were dead in our transgressions, made us alive together with Christ (by grace you have been saved),

### It occurs through the hearing of the Christian gospel

### <u>Jas 1:18</u>

James 1:18 (NASB95) — 18 In the exercise of His will He brought us forth by the word of truth, so that we would be a kind of first fruits among His creatures.

See also <u>1 Pe 1:23–25</u> The "word of God" is the good news about Jesus Christ.

1 Peter 1:23–25 (NASB95) — 23 for you have been born again not of seed which is perishable but imperishable, that is, through the living and enduring word of God.
24 For, "ALL FLESH IS LIKE GRASS, AND ALL ITS GLORY LIKE THE FLOWER OF GRASS. THE GRASS WITHERS, AND THE FLOWER FALLS OFF, 25 BUT THE WORD OF THE LORD ENDURES FOREVER." And this is the word which was preached to you.

### It is effected by God's Spirit

### <u>Jn 3:5–8</u>

John 3:5–8 (NASB95) — 5 Jesus answered, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit he cannot enter into the kingdom of God. 6 "That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit. 7 "Do not be amazed that I said to you, 'You must be born again.' 8 "The wind blows where it wishes and you hear the sound of it, but do not know where it comes from and where it is going; so is everyone who is born of the Spirit."

## See also <u>Jn 6:63; Tt 3:5</u>

John 6:63 (NASB95) — 63 "It is the Spirit who gives life; the flesh profits nothing; the words that I have spoken to you are spirit and are life.

**Titus 3:5 (NASB95)** — **5** He saved us, not on the basis of deeds which we have done in righteousness, but according to His mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewing by the Holy Spirit,

#### Regeneration is given to those who believe in Jesus Christ

### <u>1 Jn 5:1</u>

**1 John 5:1 (NASB95)** — **1** Whoever believes that Jesus is the Christ is born of God, and whoever loves the Father loves the child born of Him.

## Baptism is the sign of regeneration

<u>Jn 3:5</u> Water here is seen by some, though not all, interpreters as a reference to baptism, administered by the church to new converts as a sign of their new birth and their entry into the Christian community.

John 3:5 (NASB95) — 5 Jesus answered, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit he cannot enter into the kingdom of God.

See also Ac 2:38-39; Eph 5:25-26; Tt 3:5

Acts 2:38–39 (NASB95) — 38 Peter said to them, "Repent, and each of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins; and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. 39 "For the promise is for you and your children and for all who are far off, as many as the Lord our God will call to Himself."

**Ephesians 5:25–26 (NASB95)** — **25** Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ also loved the church and gave Himself up for her, **26** so that He might sanctify her, having cleansed her by the washing of water with the word,

**Titus 3:5 (NASB95)** — **5** He saved us, not on the basis of deeds which we have done in righteousness, but according to His mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewing by the Holy Spirit,

### The results of regeneration

#### Entry into God's kingdom

### <u>Jn 3:5</u>

John 3:5 (NASB95) — 5 Jesus answered, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit he cannot enter into the kingdom of God.

## A new holiness of life

#### <u>1 Jn 3:9</u>

**1 John 3:9 (NASB95)** — **9** No one who is born of God practices sin, because His seed abides in him; and he cannot sin, because he is born of God.

## See also <u>1 Jn 5:18</u>; <u>1 Pe 2:1–2</u>

**1 John 5:18 (NASB95)** — **18** We know that no one who is born of God sins; but He who was born of God keeps him, and the evil one does not touch him.

**1 Peter 2:1–2 (NASB95)** — **1** Therefore, putting aside all malice and all deceit and hypocrisy and envy and all slander, **2** like newborn babies, long for the pure milk of the word, so that by it you may grow in respect to salvation,

## Love for other people

## <u>1 Jn 4:7</u>

**1 John 4:7 (NASB95)** — **7** Beloved, let us love one another, for love is from God; and everyone who loves is born of God and knows God.

See also <u>1 Jn 5:2</u>

**1 John 5:2 (NASB95)** — **2** By this we know that we love the children of God, when we love God and observe His commandments.

## Victory over the world's sinful pattern of life

## <u>1 Jn 5:4</u>

**1 John 5:4 (NASB95)** — **4** For whatever is born of God overcomes the world; and this is the victory that has overcome the world—our faith.
