A Study On The Heart, Fallen and Redeemed

The inner thoughts and feelings of an unregenerate person are opposed to God, making that person reject God and his love. At conversion the renewing work of the Holy Spirit transforms the human heart, enabling it to love and obey God.

The unregenerate heart

Hostile to God

Ps 14:1

Psalm 14:1 (NASB95) — **1** The fool has said in his heart, "There is no God." They are corrupt, they have committed abominable deeds; There is no one who does good.

1 Kings 15:3 (NASB95) — **3** He walked in all the sins of his father which he had committed before him; and his heart was not wholly devoted to the LORD his God, like the heart of his father David.

2 Chronicles 12:14 (NASB95) — **14** He did evil because he did not set his heart to seek the LORD.

Proverbs 19:3 (NASB95) — **3** The foolishness of man ruins his way, And his heart rages against the LORD.

John 5:42 (NASB95) — **42** but I know you, that you do not have the love of God in yourselves.

Acts 8:21–22 (NASB95) — 21 "You have no part or portion in this matter, for your heart is not right before God. 22 "Therefore repent of this wickedness of yours, and pray the Lord that, if possible, the intention of your heart may be forgiven you.

Romans 1:31 (NASB95) — **31** without understanding, untrustworthy, unloving, unmerciful;

Romans 8:7 (NASB95) — 7 because the mind set on the flesh is hostile toward God; for it does not subject itself to the law of God, for it is not even able to do so,

Hebrews 3:12 (NASB95) — **12** Take care, brethren, that there not be in any one of you an evil, unbelieving heart that falls away from the living God.

Jeremiah 18:12 (NASB95) — **12** "But they will say, 'It's hopeless! For we are going to follow our own plans, and each of us will act according to the stubbornness of his evil heart.'

Exodus 7:3 (NASB95) — **3** "But I will harden Pharaoh's heart that I may multiply My signs and My wonders in the land of Egypt.

Exodus 7:14 (NASB95) — **14** Then the LORD said to Moses, "Pharaoh's heart is stubborn; he refuses to let the people go.

Exodus 7:22–23 (NASB95) — **22** But the magicians of Egypt did the same with their secret arts; and Pharaoh's heart was hardened, and he did not listen to them, as the LORD had said. **23** Then Pharaoh turned and went into his house with no concern even for this.

Exodus 8:15 (NASB95) — **15** But when Pharaoh saw that there was relief, he hardened his heart and did not listen to them, as the LORD had said.

Exodus 8:32 (NASB95) — **32** But Pharaoh hardened his heart this time also, and he did not let the people go.

Exodus 14:8 (NASB95) — **8** The LORD hardened the heart of Pharaoh, king of Egypt, and he chased after the sons of Israel as the sons of Israel were going out boldly.

Jeremiah 16:12 (NASB95) — **12** 'You too have done evil, even more than your forefathers; for behold, you are each one walking according to the stubbornness of his own evil heart, without listening to Me.

Daniel 5:20 (NASB95) — **20** "But when his heart was lifted up and his spirit became so proud that he behaved arrogantly, he was deposed from his royal throne and his glory was taken away from him.

Matthew 13:15 (NASB95) — 15 FOR THE HEART OF THIS PEOPLE HAS BECOME DULL, WITH THEIR EARS THEY SCARCELY HEAR, AND THEY HAVE CLOSED THEIR EYES, OTHERWISE THEY WOULD SEE WITH THEIR EYES, HEAR WITH THEIR EARS, AND UNDERSTAND WITH THEIR HEART AND RETURN, AND I WOULD HEAL THEM.'

Acts 28:27 (NASB95) — 27 FOR THE HEART OF THIS PEOPLE HAS BECOME DULL, AND WITH THEIR EARS THEY SCARCELY HEAR, AND THEY HAVE CLOSED THEIR EYES; OTHERWISE THEY MIGHT SEE WITH THEIR EYES, AND HEAR WITH THEIR EARS, AND UNDERSTAND WITH THEIR HEART AND RETURN, AND I WOULD HEAL THEM." '

Romans 2:5 (NASB95) — 5 But because of your stubbornness and unrepentant heart you are storing up wrath for yourself in the day of wrath and revelation of the righteous judgment of God,

Revelation 16:9 (NASB95) — **9** Men were scorched with fierce heat; and they blasphemed the name of God who has the power over these plagues, and they did not repent so as to give Him glory.

Revelation 16:11 (NASB95) — **11** and they blasphemed the God of heaven because of their pains and their sores; and they did not repent of their deeds.

Romans 1:21 (NASB95) — 21 For even though they knew God, they did not honor Him as God or give thanks, but they became futile in their speculations, and their foolish heart was darkened.

2 Corinthians 3:15 (NASB95) — **15** But to this day whenever Moses is read, a veil lies over their heart;

2 Corinthians 4:4 (NASB95) — **4** in whose case the god of this world has blinded the minds of the unbelieving so that they might not see the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God.

Psalm 73:7 (NASB95) — **7** Their eye bulges from fatness; The imaginations of their heart run riot.

Proverbs 18:12 (NASB95) — **12** Before destruction the heart of man is haughty, But humility goes before honor.

Jeremiah 48:29 (NASB95) — **29** "We have heard of the pride of Moab—he is very proud— Of his haughtiness, his pride, his arrogance and his self-exaltation.

Jeremiah 49:16 (NASB95) — 16 "As for the terror of you, The arrogance of your heart has deceived you, O you who live in the clefts of the rock, Who occupy the height of the hill. Though you make your nest as high as an eagle's, I will bring you down from there," declares the LORD.

Psalm 5:9 (NASB95) — **9** There is nothing reliable in what they say; Their inward part is destruction itself. Their throat is an open grave; They flatter with their tongue.

Proverbs 24:12 (NASB95) — **12** If you say, "See, we did not know this," Does He not consider it who weighs the hearts? And does He not know it who keeps your soul? And will He not render to man according to his work?

Proverbs 26:23–25 (NASB95) — **23** Like an earthen vessel overlaid with silver dross Are burning lips and a wicked heart. **24** He who hates disguises it with his lips, But he lays up deceit in his heart. **25** When he speaks graciously, do not believe him, For there are seven abominations in his heart.

Isaiah 44:20 (NASB95) — **20** He feeds on ashes; a deceived heart has turned him aside. And he cannot deliver himself, nor say, "Is there not a lie in my right hand?"

Jeremiah 22:17 (NASB95) — **17** "But your eyes and your heart Are intent only upon your own dishonest gain, And on shedding innocent blood And on practicing oppression and extortion."

2 Timothy 3:13 (NASB95) — **13** But evil men and impostors will proceed from bad to worse, deceiving and being deceived.

Psalm 41:6 (NASB95) — **6** And when he comes to see me, he speaks falsehood; His heart gathers wickedness to itself; When he goes outside, he tells it.

Psalm 55:21 (NASB95) — **21** His speech was smoother than butter, But his heart was war; His words were softer than oil, Yet they were drawn swords.

Proverbs 6:18 (NASB95) — **18** A heart that devises wicked plans, Feet that run rapidly to evil,

Proverbs 20:9 (NASB95) — **9** Who can say, "I have cleansed my heart, I am pure from my sin"?

Isaiah 1:5 (NASB95) — **5** Where will you be stricken again, As you continue in your rebellion? The whole head is sick And the whole heart is faint.

Matthew 9:4 (NASB95) — **4** And Jesus knowing their thoughts said, "Why are you thinking evil in your hearts?

Proverbs 16:5 (NASB95) — **5** Everyone who is proud in heart is an abomination to the LORD; Assuredly, he will not be unpunished.

Proverbs 17:20 (NASB95) — **20** He who has a crooked mind finds no good, And he who is perverted in his language falls into evil.

Ecclesiastes 11:9 (NASB95) — **9** Rejoice, young man, during your childhood, and let your heart be pleasant during the days of young manhood. And follow the impulses of your heart and the desires of your eyes. Yet know that God will bring you to judgment for all these things.

2 Corinthians 4:6 (NASB95) — **6** For God, who said, "Light shall shine out of darkness," is the One who has shone in our hearts to give the Light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Christ.

Acts 5:31–32 (NASB95) — 31 "He is the one whom God exalted to His right hand as a Prince and a Savior, to grant repentance to Israel, and forgiveness of sins. 32 "And we are witnesses of these things; and so is the Holy Spirit, whom God has given to those who obey Him."

Acts 15:9 (NASB95) — 9 and He made no distinction between us and them, cleansing their hearts by faith.

Acts 16:14–15 (NASB95) — 14 A woman named Lydia, from the city of Thyatira, a seller of purple fabrics, a worshiper of God, was listening; and the Lord opened her heart to respond to the things spoken by Paul. 15 And when she and her household had been baptized, she urged us, saying, "If you have judged me to be faithful to the Lord, come into my house and stay." And she prevailed upon us.

Spurious conversion

A less-than-saving change

1 Sa 10:9

1 Samuel 10:9 (NASB95) — **9** Then it happened when he turned his back to leave Samuel, God changed his heart; and all those signs came about on that day.

See also Mt 13:5–6; Mt 13:20–21; Heb 6:4–8; Heb 10:26–29

Matthew 13:5–6 (NASB95) — 5 "Others fell on the rocky places, where they did not have much soil; and immediately they sprang up, because they had no depth of soil. 6 "But when the sun had risen, they were scorched; and because they had no root, they withered away.

Matthew 13:20–21 (NASB95) — 20 "The one on whom seed was sown on the rocky places, this is the man who hears the word and immediately receives it with joy; 21 yet he has no firm root in himself, but is only temporary, and when affliction or persecution arises because of the word, immediately he falls away.

Hebrews 6:4–8 (NASB95) — 4 For in the case of those who have once been enlightened and have tasted of the heavenly gift and have been made partakers of the Holy Spirit, 5 and have tasted the good word of God and the powers of the age to come, 6 and then have fallen away, it is impossible to renew them again to repentance, since they again crucify to themselves the Son of God and put Him to open shame. 7 For ground that drinks the rain which often falls on it and brings forth vegetation useful to those for whose sake it is also tilled, receives a blessing from God; 8 but if it yields thorns and thistles, it is worthless and close to being cursed, and it ends up being burned.

Hebrews 10:26–29 (NASB95) — 26 For if we go on sinning willfully after receiving the knowledge of the truth, there no longer remains a sacrifice for sins, 27 but a terrifying expectation of judgment and THE FURY OF A FIRE WHICH WILL CONSUME THE ADVERSARIES. 28 Anyone who has set aside the Law of Moses dies without mercy on the testimony of two or three witnesses. 29 How much severer punishment do you think he will deserve who has trampled under foot the Son of God, and has regarded as unclean the blood of the covenant by which he was sanctified, and has insulted the Spirit of grace?
